Augusta
Palmer is an

Associate Professor and Chair of Communication Arts at St. Francis College in Brooklyn. She is a filmmaker and scholar who holds a Ph. D. in Cinema Studies from New York University's Tisch School of the Arts. As a documentarian, she is best known for The Hand of Fatima (2009), a feature documentary about music, mysticism, and family history. Her award-winning documentary and experimental video work has screened in national and international festivals, as well as at venues like New York's Anthology Film Archives. Her first fiction short. A is for Aye-Aye: An Abecedarian Adventure has been screened at children's film festivals from New York to New Zealand. She is currently at work on a new feature documentary, The Blues Society, which is about blues and bohemia in 1960s America.



Aura M. Jiménez Villanueva (Moderator) Aura María is HITN's Post Production &

Digital Content Coordinator, handles all the incoming video content that runs on HITN's linear channel and OTT platforms. As part of the Content Operations department, Aura Maria ensures that producers, editors and scheduling personnel adhere to the broadcasting industry standards. She also serves as the Unit Production Manager for original productions in the Eastern Region. Aura María is an excellent problemsolver and well-versed in technical concepts, possesses first-rate written and verbal communication skills. She strongly believes in an

Ben Guzman (Moderator) Ben is an awardwinning director, producer, editor, and storyteller

from Brooklyn, NY. Most recently, he served as Senior Creative Producer at Better Noise Music. managing a small team and creating content that led to three Grammy Nominations and multiple RIAA Gold and Platinum Records. Drawing inspiration from the music videos and films he grew up studying, he has spent the past decade creating a name for himself through his aggressive editing and highly stylized imagery. Garnering over 1 billion video views. Ben has created visuals for an eclectic group of artists such as The Notorious BIG, Nelly Furtado, Mötley Crüe, Kehlani, and Lupe Fiasco. His approach to each client and project is the same: tell the story the way it should be told.

San Antonio, Texas. He has worked professionally since 2014 and is the head of his own film production company, Mala Bruja Pictures. In 2020, his film, *The Quiet Shore*, was distributed by ShortsTV. In 2021, he was named "Best Local Filmmaker" by San Antonio Current Magazine. He currently teaches media and film at SAY Sí in San Antonio and serves as the Education Coordinator of the San Antonio Film Society. He is also a videographer/editor and contributing writer for La Prensa Texas.



Ana Maria García Ana Maria García is a Cuban-Puerto Rican director widely known for her work

on La Operación (Latin American Film Project, 1982) in Puerto Rico. She was one of the first women of color to work in independent documentary film. Her previous work focuses on the US-imposed forced sterilization policies on Puerto Rican women, and Cocolos y Rockeros (1992), a study on rock and salsa subcultures in Puerto Rico. Ana Maria García currently resides in Puerto Rico, where she teaches and works in Universidad del Sagrado Corazón and Universidad de Puerto Rico.



Andrew Nuño

a writer, director,
producer, and
actor from Chicago,

Illinois. Andrew creates content that focuses on untapped communities. Over the years, his work has been recognized at film festivals in both the US and abroad in countries like Portugal and Ireland. In addition, his work has screened through partnerships with organizations like the National Alliance on Mental Illness and at venues like The Chicago Cultural Center. Andrew's current project, the web-series Border'd, is currently streaming on the Emmy and Streamy-nominated web platform Open Television where the full season of Border'd is expected to premiere this summer.



Jose "Jay" E. Rivera José has been a director and music video producer for the past ten years, focusing

on the news business. His early experience ranges from customer service at Apple to working as a Media Producer for the Chicago Tribune, Technical Director for the City of Detroit, Technical Director for WGBO-WXFT, to his present position as Technical Director for News Nation. He proudly calls Humboldt Park, Chicago, his home and is a graduate of Dr. Pedro Albizu Campos Puerto Rican High School.



Juan Carlos Davila

DáVila started in the
film industry since
2006 by directing/

producing short films, music videos and working as a production and camera assistant for both local and Hollywood films shot in Puerto Rico. In 2012 he landed his first distribution deal with Cinema Libre Studio with his first documentary feature *Compañeros de lucha*. He is well known as a producer and

director, for his work in *Fast Five* (2011), *Probabilidades* (2009) and *The Stand-by Generation* (2015). His latest work is *Latinos are Essential* (2020) and *Simulcros de Liberación* (2021).



Kacho López Mari Kacho López Mari is a filmmaker and founder of Filmes Zapatero. He is a

6-time nominee and two time Latin Grammy Award winner for his music videos Ojos Color Sol (Calle 13) and Loco de Amor (Juanes). He got his start directing music videos for urban artists like Tego Calderón and Daddy Yankee, directing the videos for the singles Abayarde and Gasolina respectively. López Mari has directed music videos for Ricky Martin, Bad Bunny, Juanes, Daddy Yankee, Calle 13, Tego Calderón, Myke Towers and Chayanne among many others.



Kathryn Grant Kathryn Grant's most recent playwright, *Order My Steps* was seen at The Actors

Studio Playwright's and Director's Unit and will be adapted into a short film directed by Dr. Augusta Palmer. Her play, The Wound of Love, received the Berilla Kerr Award in playwriting and went on to full productions at The Actors Studio, Penguin Repertory Theater, the John Houseman Studio Theater and Provincetown Repertory Theater. Her play, The Good Counselor, garnered The Jerry Kaufman Award in Playwriting, The Premiere Stages Festival Award and a citation from The Harold and Mimi Steinberg/ ATCA New Play Award. The play was produced at Premiere Stages in New Jersey and 1st Stages in DC. Other plays include The Alabaster

Virgin, The Khmer Shiva and Aliyah. She is an instructor of acting, public speaking and dramatic writing at Saint Francis.



Kris Mercado Kristian Mercado is a Puerto Rican filmmaker whose music video "PA'LANTE" won

the '19 SXSW Jury Award. He's directed comedy specials for Hannibal Buress and SNL's Sam Jay. Recently, his screenplay *MELA* received a Cinereach grant. His work is celebrated for its portrayal of working class struggles, systemic oppression and visionary mixed media style.

In 2009 Verizon added Waldo's online news program to its FiOS1 News channel. Over an eight-year run, Waldo produced over 1,200 episodes that focused on outstanding people in the community. He continues telling the stories within the Hispanic community as the head of the media unit at the Center for Puerto Rican Studies at CUNY Hunter College.
